








OCN- Pathway to Regional Colleges & or Employment

St. Benedict's College are offering OCN NI Level 2 Award in Science, Religious Studies and Information Communication Technology.

OCN is a qualification currently being delivered across Northern Ireland. The Level 2 Awards are **equivalent** to a Grade B at GCSE.

The advantages of studying through OCN are:

- No examinations
- Unit based portfolio work








BTEC- Pathway to Regional Colleges & or Employment

The BTEC First Award is a vocational qualification at Level 2 or **Level 1**. The Level 2 grade is the equivalent of a GCSE grade between A*-C (dependant upon final grade achieved).

The Level 1 grade is equivalent to a GCSE grade D.

Advantages of studying BTEC:

- Many of our Pupils go on to study BTEC at Post 16
- Higher percentage of coursework than examinations.
- Pupils develop their problem solving and planning skills.
- ❖ BTEC qualifications are well-regarded by employers.
- The courses enable students to develop useful hands-on skills such as time management and communication.

ADVICE ON HOW TO CHOOSE YOUR GCSE SUBJECTS



- Choose the subjects you are likely to do best in. Use feedback you have had from your teachers to guide you.
- 2. Don't make a choice just because you like the teacher. That teacher may well not be taking the group you end up in
- 3. Be realistic about your strengths and weaknesses and accept realistic advice about the type of course you choose
- **4. Do your research** by reading the options booklet thoroughly and talking to your teachers
- 5. Above all don't choose a subject because your friend is doing it. There is no guarantee you'll end up in the same class.

THINGS TO CONSIDER



✓ Do your research; ask questions, get advice, read what is involved e.g. essays, control assessment, practical, creative, problem solving, research, analytical, sports, performing....

✓ Consider what you are thinking of studying after year 12 (college, apprenticeships, training courses and university requirements).

- ✓ Consider what relates to any career ideas you have in mind.
- ✓ Do choose what is right for YOU and strike a balance

- You need to make three choices (10F & G) or two choices (10H) from the subject list.
- Each pupil in Year 10 have been given a Expression of Interest Sheet. These forms are also available on the website:
- The deadline for making your selection is **Wednesday 28th April 2021.**
- Option sheets must be given to your form teacher during morning registration.

<u>Teacher input</u> – students can talk to Form Tutors, Miss Hutchinson; Head of Year, Mrs Devlin; Head of Careers or Mr Shivers; Curriculum Manager & Assistant Principal.

<u>Options interviews</u> – will take place with a senior member of staff once option sheets have all been submitted.

<u>Information from subject specialists</u> – teachers will deliver short talks to Year 10 classes about their subject areas and what the GCSE course entails.
